There is a problem in Native American Reservations and their living conditions. Despite the Indian Housing Authority's efforts, there are 90,000 underhoused or homeless Native Americans. This problem has negatively impacted Native Americans and their families because their living conditions are not great. Homes have inadequate plumbing, kitchens and heating. While we take running water, electricity and our other utilities for advantage, these utilities are seen as a luxury in many reservations. There is a scarcity of jobs. A possible cause of this problem is people looking the other way. Like they know what is going on but they don't try to do anything about it. The Indian Housing Authorities have tried but no one else does anything to put their goals into action. A few people are able to get jobs on the Reservation but others have to travel over 50 miles to work Seasonal jobs. Four to eight out of ten Native Americans are unemployed. There is a housing crisis on Native American lands, 30% of Native American housing is overcrowded. Native Americans have the highest rate of diabetes This is due to poverty and a lack of sufficient funding.
