Why Health Education

- Health education is vital to living a healthy, safe life.
- Puberty starts at a younger age than people expect.
- The age puberty is occurring is decreasing by an average of 3 months per decade.
- Schools are not adapting to global changes in health.
- Lower income communities and communities of color are disproportionately affected by lower puberty ages and lack of resources.

A study from 1997 shows that roughly thirty percent of girls start puberty at eight (Herman-Giddens, Marcie E., et al).
