# How the LAPD Can Effectively Discern Racially Motivated Misconduct from Justified Action




## **RESEARCH METHODOLOGIES**


The data used for this study is from existing databases and text sources.




Figure 1. A visual display of the steps taken to complete this project

Los Angeles has a long history of racism in its police department. On March 3, 1991, an African American taxi driver named Rodney King was pulled over for speeding. King got out of the car and was then brutally beaten by two police officers (Federal Bureau of Investigation. "Rodney King Video." 3 March, 1991). In the coming year, there were five days of rioting in the streets of LA, people were disgusted with what had happened. 

## **CONCLUSIONS AND ANALYSIS**

This study's findings indicate a clear difference in amount of latinx and black individuals involved in police shootings compared to white individuals. By reviewing Los Angeles Police Department incident reports, it was found that 80.4 percent of people involved in a police shooting--both fatal and non fatal--were either black or latinx (Los Angeles Police Department, 2017). This number is incredibly disproportionate and indicates that there is a problem. This study shows that the problem of racially motivated police misconduct is still very existent. The first step in creating a solution is recognizing this fact, which is the responsibility of the LAPD.
