# The Need

#### Goal

First Gen students do not get the same opportunities as their peers when it comes to entering high school

—> Many missed opportunities

First-Gen students are more likely to face academic and emotional challenges due to limited parental support and unfamiliarity with school systems (Saenz et al., 2007).

A third-year psychology major shared how she "struggled with FAFSA, academic planning, and emotional burnout," due to being the first in her family to attend college


## More evidence...

#### **Common Questions**

#### Counselors & Course Selection & Switching Classes

- Usually easy, just talk to your counselors/email them as early as possible because classes/that specific period of the class can get filled up quick
- Ask your counselor questions!!!

#### Preps

- Free periods!
- You get no preps during freshman year unless you do a sport which frees you from PE during that sport's season (also applies for sophomore year)
- Zero period PE

#### Living skills

- Living Skills is required for graduation.
- A course that helps students make informed decisions about health and well-being

Getting positive feedback on our presentation










How much better do you understand the clubs and extracurricular activities available in high school? <sup>21</sup> responses







We all come from a different starting point, so it's important to fight for equity









## **Next Steps**
