

INTRODUCTION

Patent Assertion Entities (PAEs), or "patent trolls", are companies that acquire patents to make money by using the courtroom as a weapon against small businesses. Patent trolls charge a proportionally small settlement fee to the price of fighting the suit, which is how they make most of their money.

Patent trolling has an adverse impact on innovation, the creation of small businesses, and the overall economy. It inhibits venture capitalist funding, and impedes the ability for small businesses to succeed (Meyer, 2017).

I researched the effects of patent trolling in the United States and found examples of companies that had been trolled.


Interviews

In order to answer the question of how to solve patent trolling, I interviewed various professionals in this sector about what needs to be done to solve this issue.


Analysis




Figure 2: Walter Hickey/BI, data from SSRN
