### INTRODUCTION


Witnessing a black homeless man being pinned down by police in Oceanside sparked my interest in bias policing.


### **CONCLUSIONS AND ANALYSIS**


People of color are disproportionately arrested for misdemeanors and felonies.


Black residents have the highest arrest rates for misdemeanors and felonies.

### **IMPLICATIONS AND NEXT STEPS**

• Significant racial disparities exist in felony and misdemeanor arrests in Santa Clara County • Communities of color are disproportionately impacted by the criminal justice system • Disparities have persisted over the past four decades despite changes in population demographics • Bias policing practices and systemic racism likely contribute to these disparities

> Develop and implement policies and practices that address the root causes of racial disparities in arrests, such as bias and discrimination in policing. Increase transparency and accountability in policing by collecting and reporting data on arrests by race/ethnicity and ensuring that officers are held accountable for biased behavior. Invest in alternative approaches to policing that

prioritize community-based solutions, such as restorative justice programs, mental health services, and substance abuse treatment.
